Periods of European Occupation

Algeria: France 1830 - 1962

Morocco: France (and Spain) 1800s - 1956

Egypt: UK 1880s – 1926
(Revolution in 1952)

Sudan: Egypt (and UK) 1820 – 1885
UK 1899 - 1924



European Influences

- Historically Koranic-based education in North Africa
- French/English education available to ex-pats only
- After liberation, reforms for Arabization, universalization...
- Remaining influences in language, degree structure, terms
- Colonization, hybridization, glocalization (e.g., 4-yr degrees)

Regulating Authority: Ministry of Education, Ministry of Higher Education & Scientific Research, Ministry of Universities

Medium of Instruction: Arabic (and French in the sciences)

Academic Year: September to June/July



Higher Education: First Cycle

- Provided at: *Université, École National, Institut National* (for engineering)
- Short cycle or *niveau 5* or *premier degré*
- 3-yr *Diplôme d' Études Universitaires Appliquées* (DEUA)
- Primarily technical subjects, some natural sciences, accounting
- Replaces *Technicien Supérieur* degree (2 years)



Higher Education: First Cycle

- Long cycle (parallel to short cycle) or *niveau 6* or *second degré*
- 4-yr *Licence* for humanities & social sciences
- 4-yr *Diplôme d' Études Supérieures* in sciences



Higher Education: 1st Professional Degrees

- Medicine: 7 years
- Architecture, Engineering: 5 years
- Dentistry, Pharmacy, Veterinary Medicine: 5 years



Higher Education: Second & Third Cycles

- *2-yr Maîtrise, Diplôme de Magister*: taught with thesis
- *2-yr Diplôme de Postgraduation*: thesis (best students)
- Replaced DEA
- 3-5 yr *Doctorat d'État*

Higher Education: First Cycle

- Provided at: *Université, Grande École*
- 2-yr programs, names vary by field

Certificat Universitaire d' Études Littéraires (CUEL)

Certificat Universitaire d' Études Scientifiques (CUES) or

Diplôme d' Études Universitaires Générales (DEUG)

Diplôme d' Études Universitaires de Technologie (DEUT)

Diplôme de Technicien Supérieur (after prep. classes)



Higher Education: Second Cycle

- 2-yr *Licence* in arts and humanities
- 2-yr *Maîtrise* in science and technology
- 3-yr *Diplôme d'Ingénieur d'État* in engineering



Higher Education: 1st Professional Degrees

- Medicine: 7 years
- Agronomy: 6 years
- Veterinary Medicine: 6 years



Higher Education: Third Cycle

- *2-yr Diplôme d' Études Supérieures Approfondies (DESA)*
coursework and thesis
- *2-yr Diplôme d' Études Supérieures Spécialisées (DESS)*
cannot go on to doctorate
- *3-5 yr Doctorat d' État*

Regulating Authority: Ministry of Education, Ministry of Higher Education, Supreme Council for Universities

Medium of Instruction: Arabic (and English and French)

Academic Year: September/October to May/June



Higher Education

- Provided at: university, higher institute of technical & professional training
- 4-yr Bachelor / *Bakaalouriyous* / *Licence*
Licence for arts, law and some ed. subjects
- 5-yr professional degrees in engineering, pharmacy, vet med
- 6-yr professional degree in medicine



Graduate Education

- Diploma / Diploma in Higher Studies / Diploma of Graduate Studies: 1 yr FT, does not count toward master/doctorate
- Master's / *Maajistiir*: usually 2 yrs (1 for coursework, 1 for thesis)
- Doctorate / *Duktouraah* / *Dutour El-Falsafa*: 3 – 4 yrs
- Doctor of Science: for PhDs with substantial research



Sudan



Regulating Authority: Ministry of Education, Ministry of Higher Education, National Council for Higher Ed for QA

Medium of Instruction: Arabic (English in medicine/engineering)

Academic Year: July - March



Higher Education

- Provided at: university, institute, and college of technical & professional training
- 3-yr Diplomas to prepare technicians
- 4-yr Bachelor
- 5-yr Bachelor (Honours)
- 5 or 6 -yr professional degrees in engineering, medicine, architecture



Graduate Education

- 1-2 yr Postgraduate Diplomas
- 2-3 yr Master
(1-2 yr qualifying course for non bachelor honours holders)
- 3-yr Doctorate
- Higher Doctorate: only at University of Khartoum for accomplished published work

- Reforms for French LMD (3+2+3) in Francophone N. Africa
- Pilot in 2004 in Algeria and Morocco
- Introduction of semester system, modules & credits
- Call for an African Higher Education Area
- Call for a Common Area for Higher Education in the Arab States
- '02 Lusophone Higher Education Area (ELES)
- '05 Network for Excellence & Higher Ed in W Africa (REESAO)

ALGERIA

- Global Influences on Higher Education in Algeria
- Length of Degree Programs
 - a. Licentiate (*lisans*): Four Years
 - b. Medical: Six Years (Seven with Internship)
- Types of Documents (Certificates, Provisional Certificates, Transcripts)
- Language of Documents: Much more Arabic than in Morocco, along with French
- Grading System

- Global Influences on Education in Morocco
- Length of Degree Programs
 - a. Licentiate (*ijaaza*): Four Years
 - b. Medical: Seven Years
- Types of Documents (*Relevés de notes/Attestation*)
- Language of Documents-often see the transcripts in French and the degree certificates in Arabic
- Grading System

- Global Influences on Higher Education in Egypt
- Length of Degree Programs
 - a. Bachelor's degree: four years (or five)
 - b. Medical: six years
- Types of Documents (Certificates, Transcripts, Temporary Certificates)
- Language of Documents: Mostly English, term *bakalouriyous* used in the sciences while *Licence* is used in the humanities.
- Security Features
- Grading System→unique system

SUDAN

- Global Influences on Higher Education in the Sudan
- Length of Degree Programs
 - a. Bachelor's degree: four years; honours degree: five years (or six with internship)
 - b. Medical: six years
- Types of Documents (Certificates, *shehaada*, Transcripts)
- Language of Documents: Mostly English, with an Anglo-American influence; official stamps in Arabic
- Security Features
- Grading System→sometimes Egyptian, sometimes Anglo-American

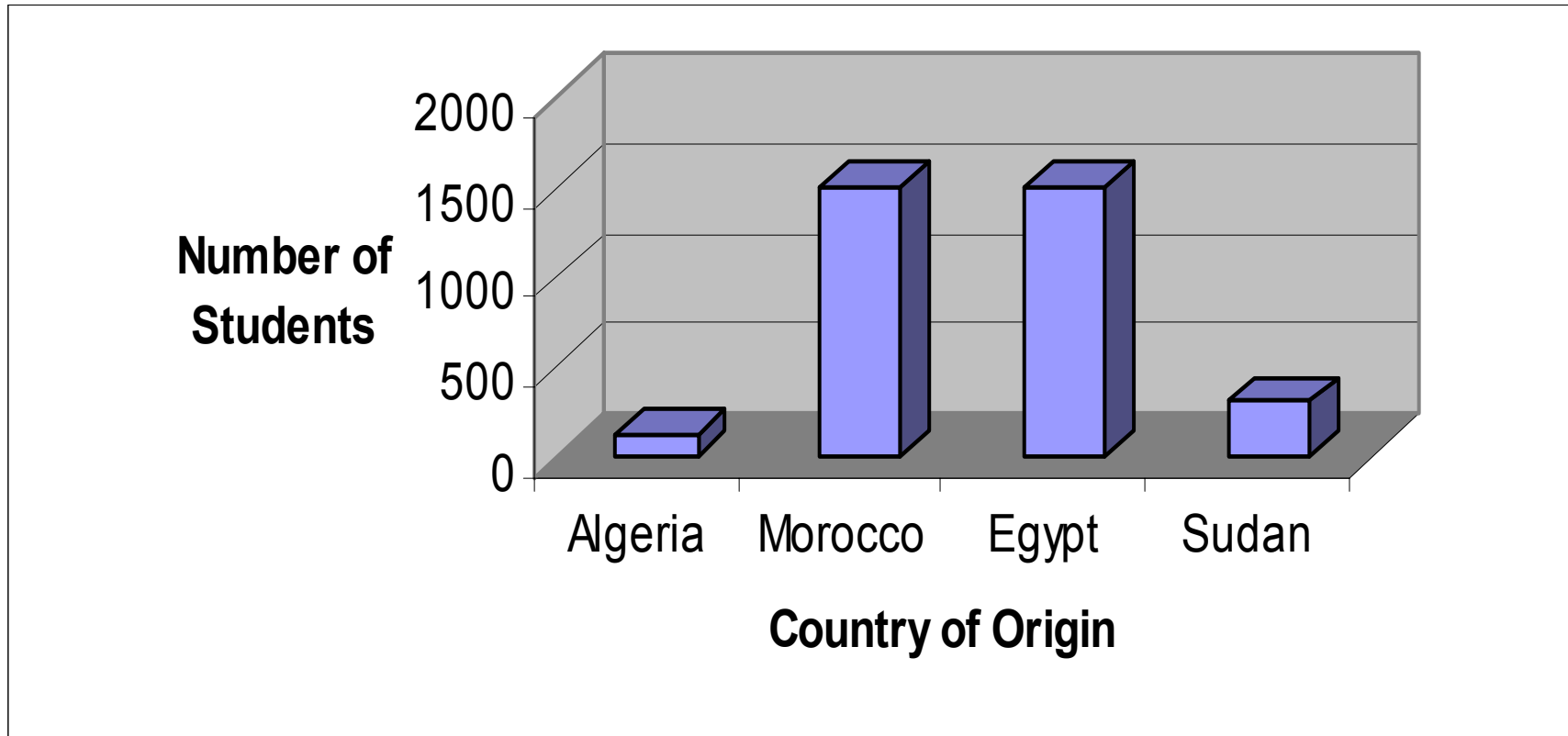
